Jenny Ramstetter, former teacher and ecologist at Marlboro College, will give this year's Thursday presentation on the Old Oaks Headwaters Preserve in Marlboro. She'll highlight the preserve's ecological features, the partnership that protected it, and the ongoing stewardship shaping this headwater landscape.

Steven Lamonde, affiliate faculty at Antioch University New England and an ecologist with Moosewood Ecological will introduce us to the Golden-winged/Blue-winged Warbler complex, highlighting his work with Audubon Vermont and his habitat-modeling research in New Hampshire.
